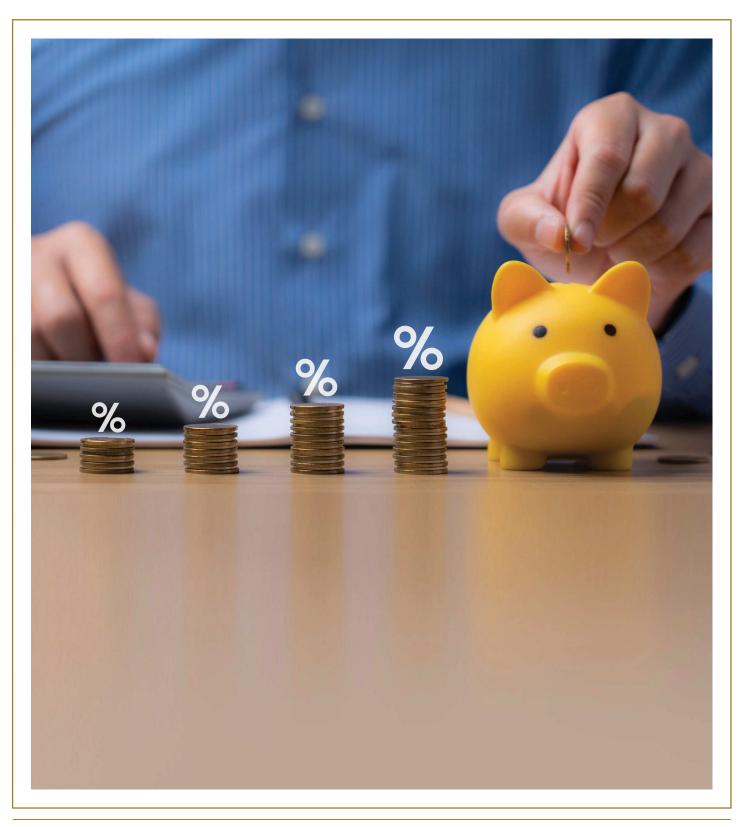

#### From the CEO's desk

June 2022

Volatility in all markets has increased substantially over the last few weeks. In such times, traders tend to reduce their positions to avoid losses caused by large market swings. The impact cost of entry or exit in to a market becomes more costly for investors. Volatility increases when there is greater uncertainty over the overall economic outlook and prospects of companies, and their valuation parameters. Past paradigms get challenged, as prices no longer comply with the immediate past narrative. New scenarios are drawn up and markets settle down at a new equilibrium after violent bouts of mood swings and significant shakedowns.

The last few months have seen global central banks swing from supporting growth to fighting inflation. Monetary policies are being tightened across economies and the US Fed is finally planning to reduce its bloated balance sheet of 9 trillion Dollars. Indian equity markets have witnessed relentless selling by foreign investors leading to lower levels in equity markets and slight turmoil in currency market as well. Bond yields have been rising as RBI increases rates, albeit cautiously. Factors like sharp wage increases, supply chain disruptions and higher commodity prices are expected to keep inflation high for the foreseeable future.

Market players could believe that current levels have already discounted the worst that the central bankers can do, and hence could conclude that a strategic entry into equity/bond markets is warranted at this point. Then there could be a few fearful people, who believe that the impact of the tightening is yet to manifest fully in the real economy and that the unprecedented withdrawal of liquidity by Fed could lead to unwinding of long positions in risky assets like equities, cryptos, NFTs etc. Only time will tell whether the current weakness in global equities a mere blip in the long term bull market or will the correction deepen over the next few months and quarters.

The fact is that we are at crossroads wherein central banks, as well as other market participants are unsure of the future and will react to emerging data points leading to continued volatility across markets until clarity and consensus emerges.

#### **Fixed Income Views**



#### **Market Commentary:**

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) in its June 2022 MPC review raised reportate by 50bps to take it to 4.90% and maintained its stance as "focus on withdrawal of accommodation." The GDP growth rate was retained at 7.2% however, CPI was revised to 6.7% for FY 2022-23 (from 5.7% earlier). High inflation across the globe, slowing global growth, pandemic led supply chain issues and high commodity prices due to geopolitical issues continue to be key risks for recovery of domestic economy.

The headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) reading for May 2022 stood at 7.04% (7.79% previous month), owing to excise duty cuts on fuel and relatively cheaper food prices. Core-CPI reading also slowed down to 5.90% (from 7.24% earlier) and Index of Industrial Production (IIP) witnessed a growth of 7.1% YoY (as opposed to 1.9% earlier). Wholesale Price Index (WPI) spiked to 15.88%, thereby touching a three-decade high (from 15.08% in the previous month). The input prices have been persistently rising, forcing firms to hike output prices. India still faces inflationary risks due to the Russia-Ukraine conflict which continues to create supply-chain bottlenecks globally.

The average liquidity for June 2022 stood at ~ INR 2.87 trn, considerably lower than the previous month (INR ~4.34 trn). The month of June 2022 witnessed three Variable Reverse Repo Rate (VRRR) auctions. The total amount auctioned was worth INR 2.6 trn, considerably lower than the previous month (INR 6.4 trn) with a weighted average cut off at 4.72%. Furthermore, the indicative borrowing for Q2 FY 22-23 is estimated INR 2.73 trn via TBills (vis-à-vis INR 4.32 trn in Q1 FY 22-23) and INR 2.1 trn via State Loans (vis-à-vis INR 1.9 trn in Q1 FY 22-23).

After half a decade of GST implementation and the collections crossing the INR 1 trillion mark for the 12th straight month, the GST kitty for June 2022 scaled to INR 1.44 trn— which is 56% higher than in June 2021. This is the second highest GST collection since April 2022. This robust tax collection can be attributed to efforts taken by the government to check tax evasion, constant improvements in the GST mechanism and better indirect tax administration.

Foreign capital flows have not been enthusing confidence in the economy as FPIs have been heavily selling for 9 straight months now with an overall outflow of  $\sim$  USD 34 billion so far. The rupee continues to depreciate and is close to 78.9 a dollar, currently trading at its weakest level.

On the global front, Brent crude has been on the rise and closed at \$114.81 at the end of the month. The US CPI accelerated by 8.6% which is the highest since 1981. Food, shelter and gasoline prices have been the major contributors to this rise in inflation which has in-turn led to an increase in the US government bond yields.

#### Outlook:

Post the sudden change in stance in the April 2022 policy meeting and thereafter with a surprise hike in May 2022, the markets had turned significantly bearish and pricing in rapid rate hikes. However, with the June 2022 policy commentary, markets were able to tone down the excessive bearishness and thereafter yields have softened by almost 25-30 bps from peaks. Markets now have been rangebound and are unlikely to reflect definitive movements unless triggered by specific events. We believe that the MPC will continue to hike rates as it has spoken about reaching positive to neutral real rates. Given the backdrop, we believe that the shorter end of the curve still provides the best risk reward ratio as that part of the curve appears to have discounted bulk of the rate hikes and is relatively less rate-sensitive.

#### How to read a Factsheet



Here are a few important terms that you need to know while reading a factsheet.

Fund Manager: An employee of the asset management company of a mutual fund, who manages investments of the scheme. He is a part of Investment Team

Application Amount for Fresh Subscription: This is the minimum investment amount for a new investor in a mutual fund scheme.

Minimum Additional Amount: This is the minimum investment amount for an existing investor in a mutual fund scheme.

Yield to Maturity: The Yield to Maturity or the YTM is the rate of return anticipated on a bond if held until maturity. YTM is expressed as an annual rate. The YTM factors in the bond's current market price, par value, coupon interest rate and time to maturity.

SIP: SIP or systematic investment plan works on the principle of making periodic investments of all xed sum in the scheme of Mutual Fund. For instance, an investor may opt for an SIP that invests Rs 500 every 15th of the month in any mutual fund scheme.

**NAV:** The NAV or the net asset value is the total asset value per unit of the mutual fund after deducting all related and permissible expenses. The NAV is calculated at the end of every business day. It is the value at which the investor enters or exits the mutual fund.

**Benchmark:** A group of securities, usually a market index, whose performance is used as a standard or benchmark to measure investment performance of mutual funds, among other investments. Some typical benchmarks include the Nifty, Sensex, BSE200, BSE500, 10-Year G-sec. etc.

Entry Load: A mutual fund may have a sales charge or load at the time of entry and/or exit to compensate the distributor/agent in compliance with the guidelines specified by SEBI.

Note: SEBI, vide circular dated June 30, 2009 has abolished entry load and mandated that the upfront commission to distributors will be paid by the investor directly to the distributor, based on his assessment of various factors including the service rendered by the distributor.

Exit Load: Exit load is charged at the time an investor redeems the units of a mutual fund. The exit load is deducted from the prevailing NAV at the time of redemption. For instance, if the NAV is 100 and the exit load is 1%, the redemption price would be 99 Per Unit.

Modified Duration: Modified duration is the price sensitivity and the percentage change in price for a unit change in yield

**Standard Deviation:** Standard deviation is a statistical measure of the range of an investment's performance. When a mutual fund has a high standard deviation, it means its range of performance is wide, implying greater volatility.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe Ratio, named after its founder, the Nobel Laureate William Sharpe, is a measure of risk-adjusted returns. It is calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk.

**Beta:** Beta is a measure of an investment's volatility vis-à-vis the market. Beta of less than 1 means that the security will be less volatile than the market. A beta of greater than 1 implies that the security's price will be more volatile than the market.

**AUM:** AUM or assets under management refers to the recent / updated cumulative market value of investments managed by a mutual fund or any investment firm

Holdings: The holdings or the portfolio is a mutual fund's latest or updated reported statement of investments/securities. These are usually displayed in terms of percentage to net assets or the rupee value or both. The objective is to give investors an idea of where their money is being invested by the fund manager.

**Nature of Scheme:** The investment objective and underlying investments determine the nature of the mutual fund scheme. For instance, a mutual fund that aims at generating capital appreciation by investing in stock markets is an equity fund or growth fund. Likewise, a mutual fund that aims at capital preservation by investing in debt markets is a debt fund or income fund. Each of these categories may have sub-categories.

Rating Profile: Mutual funds invest in securities after evaluating their creditworthiness as disclosed by the ratings. A depiction of the mutual fund in various investments based on their ratings becomes the rating profile of the fund. Typically, this is a feature of debt funds.
